

Pupils' learning is inspired and supported by specialist staff, excellent facilities and numerous educational visits, as well as by regular visiting speakers. Millhillians' present-day exploration of ideas, culture and communication is a fitting tribute to our most famous former teacher; Sir James Murray was the inaugural editor of the Oxford English Dictionary, a project which began in 1879 in a building on the School grounds.

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Francis Crick, the Nobel Prizewinner, was a pupil in the 1930s, and later paid tribute to his education here: "My whole scientific career was grounded in the excellent science teaching I had at Mill Hill." The Faculty now comprises Biology, Chemistry, Physics and Psychology, all taught by subject specialists who place an equal importance on conceptual and practical learning.

Maths is Mill Hill's most widely studied subject at GCSE and A Level. Pupils are encouraged to develop the logic and problem-solving skills at the heart of modern mathematical learning.

COMPUTER SCIENCES WE SUPPORT INNOVATION

All pupils follow a Computing course when they join Mill Hill, in order to develop their logical and analytical skills, as well as to learn programming languages. Many elect to study GCSE and A Level Computer Science, which teaches a solution-led approach to real-world issues. Digital Media A Level is also on offer and is designed to develop a variety of techniques and strategies for use across a wide range of modern-day applications.

We support innovation and discovery, creating opportunities outside the classroom for pupils to explore new ideas, and follow up the entrepreneurial streak common to many Millhillians.

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Art is very popular at GCSE and A Level, and many of our A Level artists leave for Art Foundation courses, Fine Art, History of Art, Architecture, Fashion and other art and design related disciplines. This is no new tradition; a lifetime ago, Old Millhillian Sir Norman Hartnell designed the Queen's wedding dress and Coronation gown.

Design Technology has a high profile at Mill Hill, with Sixth Form pupils moving on each year to university courses such as Product Design, Architecture, Design Engineering and Automotive Design. Younger pupils regularly triumph in national design competitions, and a number of Sixth Form pupils have held prestigious Arkwright Engineering Scholarships. "Leaders establish an ethos where the wellbeing of pupils is well supported in a culture of mutual respect for all groups of people."

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PASTORAL CARE AND WELLBEING

Millhillians have a formal say in the running of their school through a variety of representative councils and committees, many of which have an explicitly pastoral focus.


Our Wellbeing Wing provides a calm and relaxing space available to all pupils during the school day.

Whilst our houses have rich histories and traditions, our boarding model is modern and non-hierarchical, with pastoral care at the centre of all we do. Every boarder's voice is important to us, and our House staff are dedicated to creating a family atmosphere in which acceptance, empathy and mutual endeavour are always to the fore.

Our boarders develop a close attachment to their particular House, where they live and study under the Housemaster or Housemistress who

knows them well and who maintains a close relationship with their families back home.

Younger pupils' homework is supervised and supported by House staff and Visiting Tutors. Senior boarders develop an independence that will serve them well at university.

All boarders come together as a wider boarding community for breakfast, supper and a variety of evening and weekend activities, society meetings, creative and academic workshops and trips in and around London.

Fun and memorable in themselves, these weekly activities build in our pupils the key skills necessary to stand out at university and with employers. Our numerous on-site activities are supplemented by over 120 days out and 35+ residential trips each year, ranging from academically focused visits to our global partnership projects in countries such as India and Zambia or sports tours in the UK, Europe and across the world.

We hold an annual singing competition as well as a biennial House Music Festival for specialist and nonspecialist musicians alike. The Chapel Choir and other ensembles tour in the UK and Europe.

Academic Music is a popular choice, available at both GCSE and A Level. Pupils benefit from the excellent facilities of the McClure Music School, with its Recital Hall, recording studio and practice suites.

Theatre and performance are in our lifeblood at Mill Hill, having helped to nurture a host of actors, writers and broadcasters through the 20th and 21st Centuries. Patrick Troughton, the



second Doctor Who, was a pupil here, as was his grandson Harry Melling who appeared in the Harry Potter films and Nancy Zamit, West End and Broadway actress best known for The Play That Goes Wrong.

Recent major productions have included High School Musical, Julius Caesar and Bugsy Malone! The House Drama Festival takes place every other year and involves pupils from all year groups. Facilities include a main stage, purpose-built theatre and Drama Studio.

Drama is available at both GCSE and A Level.


Acres of grounds and facilities Through sport, our pupils build character and qualities that will serve them well in future life.

The experiences and lasting memories created at school are without doubt intrinsically linked to the people you are surrounded by, both teachers and other pupils. There are two things that stand out when I consider my time at Mill Hill: the sport and the trips. Playing sport, especially Cricket, was one of the main ways I bonded with friends at the same time as pursuing something that was fun and that I was passionate about. 


MATTHEW POLITICS UNIVERSITY OF LEEDS

From the Business Studies Department I was regularly given feedback, and I was provided with the tools I needed to revise through workshops on weekends before my exams.
