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1. 3+ and 4+ Entry 2020

Registration for 3+ and 4+ entrance for September 2020 is still open. The first 70 children to register are placed on the initial registration list; however, when our initial registration list is oversubscribed all registrations received thereafter will be placed on our reserve registration list and we are unable to guarantee that your child will be invited for an assessment.



5. Nursery Class

Our Nursery class for three to four year olds, offers a morning or an afternoon session in a stimulating and secure environment.

Miss Adene Davey, the Nursery Teacher and two Nursery Assistants provide a programme of activities which offers variety and is developmentally appropriate to the individual child.

The activities are organised to allow the child to explore and learn following the Early Years Foundation Stage. The children are given time to investigate and experiment and engage in open ended play.

They are encouraged to set up activities and tidy them away, teaching them to care for their environment. The children engage in both adult directed and child initiated activities throughout the session.

“We give your child individual attention: we understand their strengths, weaknesses and enthusiasms.”



The Nursery class is an integral part of the whole school and uses its facilities to the full. Each term the children work on different topics using the ‘Early Years Foundation Stage’ as a framework for planning.

Language Development

Pre-reading skills are introduced, through a range of activities, which offer a wealth of opportunity to discover a love of books, through stories, poems, songs, rhymes and story telling.

The Nursery follow the ‘Jolly Phonics’ scheme of work and during the spring and summer term the children are introduced to all the single sounds of the alphabet before they move on to Reception.

Writing skills are developed through a range of activities designed to strengthen fine motor skills. This will encourage mark making in a variety of ways including, colouring, tracing, painting and name writing, using the lead in stroke ready for joined cursive script.

Speaking and listening is an integral part of everyday life in our Nursery. The children are encouraged to share their ideas with each other, as well as listen to and understand instructions.

The Nursery classroom offers a home corner, reading and listening area, a painting area, sand and water, a wealth of construction toys and puzzles. It has its own quiet, safely fenced outdoor play area, offering a safe adventure playground.

If you would like your child to be considered for a place please register as quickly as possible as we only have one intake a year in September.

Your son or daughter must be three years old by the 1st September in the year you require a place.

Under normal circumstances we would expect all the children in our Nursery classes to move on into one of our three Reception classes the following September.

Problem Solving, Reasoning and Numeracy

Practical activities provide the foundation for numeracy. The children use mathematical language, become familiar with number rhymes, songs and stories and begin to use their mathematical understanding to solve practical problems. Numicon is used throughout the year to encourage and stimulate mathematical development in Nursery.

Music

The Children are given the opportunity to sing, use musical instruments and listen to a variety of music with our specialist teachers.

PE

Drama, movement, apparatus and games takes place in the hall with our specialist teacher.

Technology

The children have access to their own computer, printer, interactive white board, camera and programmable toys in the classroom developing their IT skills. They cook and design and make, according to the topic the class is involved in.

6. Stay & Play - After School Club

Stay & Play is our flexible after school care provision for children who wish or need to stay at school beyond school hours and are not in a club.

We provide children with a fun and productive experience with a wide choice of planned activities.

Who can attend?

Open to all Reception, Year 1 & Year 2 pupils. Afternoon Nursery can also be permitted to attend, providing the Nursery teacher is happy that the pupil has settled well and is ready to stay later into the day. This will be discussed on an individual basis.

Daily between the times of 3:15–5:30pm. Stay & Play sessions are held in either a reception or a nursery classroom, with the option of outdoor play (weather depending) as well as games and activities being held in the hall.

The children are to be collected via the nursery entrance and playground. Please ring the doorbell. If the children are in the playground and the gate is locked then please

use the bell located next to the gate. When collecting your child please ensure to sign out on the sheet provided stating the time of departure. You must inform us via the school office of any changes regarding your usual collection arrangements

Refreshments

All Children will be provided with a snack which will consist of crackers and cheese or bread and butter, a selection of fruit and crudités and a drink. This is followed by a choice of a plain or chocolate biscuit. We are automatically informed of any allergies as we are part of Grimsdell School.

Activities

Our Grimsdell assistants provide the after school care. There will be an adult led activity for those that wish to participate and a range of activities for the children to choose, such as board games, artwork, role play and construction. Homework is not encouraged at Stay & Play, although if a child wishes to do their homework independently this can be facilitated.
