- Roll on and roll off substitutions all must be at the knowledge of the referee.
- Restarts only on the referee's whistle.
- Please arrive at 8:30 for warm-ups so that we can kick-off at 9:00 am.
- In the event of a tie for positions in the group, goals scored in all the group games will come into play, then the result between the sides involved. If it is still a tie, then a penalty shootout will take place. (3 each then sudden death).

U11 BOYS FOOTBALL FESTIVAL (7-A-SIDE)

- Maximum squad size 11 players
- 7-a-side matches.
- Normal ISFA rules.
- RULES OF THE GAME: The normal Laws of the Game will apply. However,
  - a. There will be no offside
  - b. At all restarts players must be at least five yards from the ball.
  - c. A goalkeeper may not kick the ball from out of his hands by means of punt or drop-kick. (NB A goalkeeper wishing to kick the ball may release the ball onto the ground to do so)
- All games will be 2 x 5 min halves with a 1 min half time interval.
- 3 points for a win, 2 for a draw, and 1 for loss.
- 1 bonus point for 4 or more goals in one match.
- Roll on and roll off substitutions- all must be at the knowledge of the referee.
- Restarts only on the referee’s whistle.
- Please arrive at 8:30 for warm-ups so that we can kick off at 9:00 am.

## YOUNG PLAYERS

### WHEN PLAYING FOOTBALL I WILL:

- Always play to the best of my ability and for the benefit of my team
- Play fairly – I won't cheat, dive, complain or waste time
- Respect my team-mates, the other team, the referee or my coach/manager
- Play by the rules, as directed by the referee
- Be gracious in victory and defeat – I will shake hands with the other team and referee at the end of the game
- Listen and respond to what my coach/team manager tells me
- Understand that a coach has to do what is best for the team and not one individual player
- Talk to someone I trust or the club welfare officer if I'm unhappy about anything at my club.

I understand that if I do not follow the code, any/all of the following actions may be taken by my club, county FA or The FA:

### I MAY:

- Be required to apologise to my team-mates, the other team, referee or team manager
- Receive a formal warning from the coach or the club committee
- Be dropped or substituted
- Be suspended from training
- Be required to leave the club.

### IN ADDITION:

- My club, County FA or The FA may make my parent or carer aware of any infringements of the Code of Conduct
- The FA/County FA could impose a fine and suspension against my club.



## SPECTATORS

We all bear a collective responsibility to set a good example and help provide a positive environment in which children can learn and enjoy the game. Play your part and observe The FA's Respect Code of Conduct for spectators at all times.

### I WILL:

- Remember that children play for FUN
- Applaud effort and good play as well as success
- Respect the Referee's decisions even when you don't agree with them
- Appreciate good play from whatever team it comes from
- Remain behind the touchline and within the Designated Spectators' Area
- Let the coach do their job and not confuse the players by telling them what to do
- Encourage the players to respect the opposition, referee and match officials
- Support positively and offer players encouragement not criticism
- Never engage in, or tolerate offensive, insulting or abusive language or behaviour

I understand that if I do not follow the Code, any/all of the following actions may be taken:

### I MAY BE:

- Issued with a verbal warning from a club or league official
- Required to meet with the club, league or CFA Welfare Officer
- Required to meet with the club committee
- Obligated to undertake an FA education course
- Obligated to leave the match venue by the club
- Requested by the club not to attend future games
- Suspended or have my club membership removed
- Required to leave the club along with any dependents.

### IN ADDITION:

- The FA/County FA could impose a fine and/or suspension on the club.





## COACHES, TEAM MANAGERS AND CLUB OFFICIALS

We all bear a collective responsibility to set a good example and help provide a positive environment in which children can learn and enjoy the game. Play your part and observe The FA's Respect Code of Conduct at all times.

### ON AND OFF THE FIELD, I WILL:

- Use my position to set a positive example for the young people I am responsible for
- Show respect to others involved in the game including match officials, opposition players, coaches, managers, officials and spectators
- Adhere to the laws and spirit of the game
- Promote Fair Play and high standards of behaviour
- Respect the match official's decision
- Never enter the field of play without the referee's permission
- Never engage in, or tolerate, offensive, insulting or abusive language or behaviour
- Be gracious in victory and defeat.

### WHEN WORKING WITH PLAYERS, I WILL:

- Place the well-being, safety and enjoyment of each player above everything, including winning
- Never engage in or tolerate any form of bullying
- Encourage each player to accept responsibility for their own behaviour and performance
- Ensure all activities I organise are appropriate for the players' ability level, age and maturity
- Co-operate fully with others in football (e.g. officials, doctors, physiotherapists, welfare officers) for each player's best interests.
